What is Reverse Tashlich?

During the Days of Awe, Jews around the world participate in the ancient ritual of Tashlich. We go to a body of water and symbolically cast off the sins of the past year into the water to start the New Year renewed. However, this is not the only time humans cast something into the sea.

Every year, over six million tons of human-made trash enter the water, endangering every living thing that calls the sea its home. Marine debris is a blatant violation of the fundamental Jewish ethical principle Bal Tashchit. Let us add a modern ritual to this Jewish tradition: cleaning up our precious beaches during the Days of Awe.
